



Directing Workshop – Level 1 Course Outline

Course Description:

An eleven-week directing workshop focusing primarily on how to work with actors. Four directors and eight actors explore all aspects of directing/actor communication. While concentrating on performance issues, the course also touches on script analysis and design.

SCHEDULE:

Week 1

- Auditioning techniques: The directors are shown specific techniques designed to relax actors and maximize performance potential
- They also become familiar with assessment techniques, so they have a better idea of what's in store for them after hiring an actor
- The directors practice running auditions utilizing the actors in the workshop

Week 2

- An introduction to the approach—lecture and exercises
- Exercises include observing improvisations and picking out what frees up the actors and what makes their work more effortful
- More than fifty specific rehearsal techniques are shared
- Directors cast their scenes and begin working outside of class with their actors

Week 3

- Lecture and exercise work continues
- An additional fifty, or so, rehearsal and performance tools are introduced
- Directors rotate working with actors on monologues and experiment with newly-learned 'techniques

Week 4 – Week 7

- The first round of scenes
- Directors rehearse in front of the workshop. The teacher facilitates the rehearsal, making suggestions when appropriate and pointing out communication problems as they occur.
- Each scene will get worked on for 2 hours

Week 8 – Week 11

- Same as weeks four through seven, but now the directors can work on any sort of material they choose.
