## About The Barrow Group

### Mission

The Barrow Group combines unpredictable, spontaneous acting with well-crafted stories that address social, spiritual, and political issues to create an immediate, authentic connection between actors, audiences, and the writing.

### Background

- TBG is a non-profit organization founded in 1986
- TBG operates a 9,000 square foot arts center in midtown Manhattan, comprised of a 99-seat theatre, a 40-seat theatre, and four studios
- TBG has developed and/or produced over 150 shows since 1986, including: Martin Moran's *The Tricky Part* (Obie Award & Drama Desk nominations), Jon Marans' *The Temperamentals* (Drama Desk Award), Mike Birbiglia's *My Girlfriend's Boyfriend* (Lucille Lortel Award), and Martin Moran's *All the Rage* (Lucille Lortel Award)
