Rey Parla Director

Rey (b. 1971, Miami) is a multi-hyphenate Cuban American artist who has worked as a writer-editor/photographer-cameraman/post-production and studio art director, documentarian/creative strategist/co-director, and producer deeply immersed in New York City's vibrant art scene for two decades. Rey is passionately curious about everything and thrives on wearing many hats. He received a B.A. in English Literature and a B.A. in Interdisciplinary Arts with a Certificate in Film Studies from Florida International University (F.I.U., his alma mater). Rev experimented with theater and participated as an actor in Florida at Valencia College Theater with playwright Bobby Bell and Director Paul Wakefield, Improvisation at The Mental Floss Theater with Stuart Solomon in Coral Gables, and with The Prometeo Theater at Miami Dade College, where he studied with actors Teresa María Rojas and Joshua Braun. Rey continued with independent film studies at the Alliance Film & Video Cooperative in Miami Beach, where he studied with avant-garde film

director Mark Boswell of Nova Kino, Sergio Giral, a Cuban American screenwriter and director, and Cuban filmmaker Dinorah de Jesús Rodriguez, amongst other luminary teaching artists.

After completing The Independent Feature Project New York filmmakers' program on scholarship, Rey co-wrote and co-produced a short narrative film, which garnered acclaim at international film festivals. He also gained recognition for his hand-painted films, showcased at prestigious festivals and galleries worldwide, such as The Miami International Film Festival: The Avant-Garde Returns, The Brooklyn Academy of Music, and The Maysles Documentary Center. Rey's artwork is characterized by frenetic yet meticulously crafted imagery that challenges conventional notions of representation, drawing inspiration from the likes of Bridget Riley, Man Ray, Jean Dubuffet, and Stan Brakhage. As a co-founder, Rey collaborates with his younger brother, painter Jose Parla, daily at parlastudios.com on all things art. He is also proud to be known for photographing and documenting Jose's painting process. He is now co-producing a 24-minute documentary of his brother's work for PAMM.TV. His documentary photographs have been published in Forbes, Brooklyn Rail, timesensitive.fm, N.Y. Daily News, Juxtapoz Magazine, Atlanta Journal-Constitution, Champ Magazine, Cultured Magazine, foreign periodicals, artist monographs, and global underground zines. Rey has spoken and presented his work at the INSPIRE Conference for Savannah College of Art & Design. His art is in private collections and is represented by Ben Rubi Gallery in New York City.


Anastasia Locke
